



Tri-State Jazz Society, formed in 1988, is dedicated to the preservation and live performance of traditional jazz. Concerts featuring leading professional soloists and bands are presented throughout the year. Events are open to the public and all who enjoy traditional jazz are invited to join. The society is a non-profit educational corporation supported by its members.

Admission Prices

General admission to band and piano concerts is \$20 unless otherwise stated. Non-members are invited to attend their first concert for half price (\$10). If they join, admission is free for new members' first concert. Like all other members, they will pay half price at all regular concerts for the balance of their 12-month membership. High school and college students with school identification are admitted free to all concerts. Younger children with a paying adult are also free.

Membership

Basic dues are \$20 per person. New and renewal memberships can be started in any month and run for 12 months. In addition to half-price concert admissions, members receive the *Strutter* newsletter by email. Premium memberships help sustain and expand the work of Tri-State Jazz Society. Individual Sponsors contribute at the \$50 level (\$70 for couples); Patrons, \$100 (\$120 for couples); Sustainers \$200 or more (\$220 or more for couples). Premium-level members may request mail delivery of the *Strutter* at no extra charge. They are also eligible to attend an annual reception for Sponsors, Patrons and Sustainers. Dues and donations may be tax deductible under IRS Section 501(c)(3).

4/15/18 Haddonfield	Richard Barnes Blackbird Society Orchestra Like last year's sold-out concert, the 13-piece jazz orchestra will expand to 22 pieces in 2nd set for a Paul Whiteman tribute. Vince Giordano is special guest.
5/20/18 Haddonfield	Neville Dickie and the Midiri Brothers Neville is coming from England and is on piano, Joe Midiri is on clarinet, Paul Midiri is on drums. It's an annual tradition. Come early; it may be a full house.
6/3/18 Wallingford	Danny Tobias and Friends Trumpeter Danny Tobias will return to TSJS with his quintet, featuring Paul Midiri on vibes, Joe Holt on piano, Joe Plowman on bass and Jim Lawlor on drums.
6/24/18 Haddonfield	Al Harrison Dixieland Band Trumpeter Al Harrison will be returning to TSJS with a sextet. The program will again feature authentic early New Orleans jazz and traditional jazz standards.
7/15/18 Wallingford	Tri-State Jazz All-Stars Reedman Bob Rawlins again leads a core band of TSJS top artists drawn from local bands. They will be jamming on Dixieland tunes with invited sit-in guests.
8/19/18 Haddonfield	Cynthia Sayer and her Joyride Band Banjo virtuoso and vocalist Cynthia Sayer has been called top 4-string jazz banjoist in the world, leads NYC quintet with banjo, clarinet, trumpet, bass and drums.
9/9/18 Wallingford	Jon Weber - Solo Piano Based in New York, Jon Weber has recorded and toured all over the world. For his TSJS debut, expect an emphasis on stride and other early jazz styles.
10/14/18 Haddonfield	Emily Asher's Garden Party The quintet, led by trombonist Emily Asher is one of New York's most exciting traditional jazz groups. This concert is supported by a grant from Camden County.
11/18/18 Wallingford	Original Cornell Syncopators 12-piece band, students of Cornell University, talented beyond their years. They were invited twice to the San Diego Jazz Festival. Come see the future of trad jazz.
