PHILADELPHIA – On his fourth encore tour from England, accomplished stride and boogie-woogie pianist Neville Dickie will rejoin Tri-State Jazz veterans Joe and Paul Midiri at Haddonfield United Methodist Church, 29 Warwick Road, Haddonfield, NJ on Sunday, June 4th, at 2:00 p.m. for a program of exciting traditional jazz, stride and swing. A regular performer on BBC Radio, Dickie's made hundreds of appearances as a soloist or with his trio and is one of the few British jazz players to score with a hit single. At home, Joe and Paul Midiri have made both jazz and classical music the focus of their lives since they graduated from Glassboro State College (now Rowan University) recording with everything from trios to big bands featuring the arrangements of Benny Goodman, Artie Shaw and the Dorsey Brothers, as well as Paul's original arrangements and compositions.

Half-price admission of \$10, payable at the door, is available for first-time attendees and members; general admission is \$20; full-time students with IDs and children are free. There are no advance sales or reservations. The church is about 15 minutes from central Philadelphia via the Ben Franklin Bridge and parking is free. PATCO is nearby.
