



Tri-State Jazz Society, formed in 1988, is dedicated to the preservation and live performance of traditional jazz. Concerts featuring leading professional soloists and bands are presented throughout the year. Events are open to the public and all who enjoy traditional jazz are invited to join. The society is a non-profit educational corporation supported by its members.

### Admission Prices

General admission to band and piano concerts is \$20 unless otherwise stated. Non-members are invited to attend their first concert for half price (\$10). If they join, admission is free for new members' first concert. Like all other members, they will pay half price at all regular concerts for the balance of their 12-month membership. High school and college students with school identification are admitted free to all concerts. Younger children with a paying adult are also free.

### Membership

Basic dues are \$20 per person. New and renewal memberships can be started in any month and run for 12 months. In addition to half-price concert admissions, members receive the *Strutter* newsletter by email. Premium memberships help sustain and expand the work of Tri-State Jazz Society. Individual Sponsors contribute at the \$50 level (\$70 for couples); Patrons, \$100 (\$120 for couples); Sustainers \$200 or more (\$220 or more for couples). Premium-level members may request mail delivery of the *Strutter* at no extra charge. They are also eligible to attend an annual reception for Sponsors, Patrons and Sustainers. Dues and donations may be tax deductible under IRS Section 501(c)(3).

<b>11/18/18</b> Wallingford	<b>Original Cornell Syncopators</b> 12-piece band, students of Cornell University, talented beyond their years. They were invited twice to the San Diego Jazz Festival. Come see the future of trad jazz.
<b>1/6/19</b> Haddonfield	<b>Mike Davis and the New Wonders</b> Welcome one of New York's top trad jazz bands to their TSJS debut; 7-piece band with cornet/trumpet, reeds, trombone, piano, guitar/banjo, bass sax, and drums.
<b>2/10/19</b> Wallingford	<b>Barbone Street Jazz Band</b> Clarinetist Steve Barbone leads one of the area's best and most experienced Dixieland bands. It has become the busiest trad jazz group in the Delaware Valley.
<b>3/17/19</b> Haddonfield	<b>The Anderson Brothers Play Benny Goodman</b> NY reed virtuosos Will and Peter Anderson return to Tri-State Jazz. Swinging quintet with Adam Moezinia, guitar; Clovis Nicolas, bass; and Philip Stewart, drums.
<b>4/7/19</b> Wallingford	<b>Ostwald's Louis Armstrong Eternity Band</b> David Ostwald's New York band never stops celebrating the Armstrong legacy. David grew up in Swarthmore, leads, plays tuba and string bass at his TSJS debut.
<b>5/19/19</b> Haddonfield	<b>Neville Dickie and the Midiri Brothers</b> Neville is coming from England and is on piano, Joe Midiri is on clarinet, Paul Midiri on drums. It's an annual tradition. Come early; it may be a full house.
<b>6/2/19</b> Wallingford	<b>Ben Mauger's Vintage Jazz Band</b> Cornetist Ben Mauger returns to TSJS with New Orleans-style Dixieland, hot dance tunes of the 20s and 30s, other early jazz; last appeared at TSJS in 2016.
<b>7/14/19</b> Haddonfield	<b>Tri-State Jazz All Stars</b> An annual tradition, this year in Haddonfield, a core band of top performers from some of our favorite bands will jam together on familiar Dixieland tunes.
